Every coach, player and parent represent GBU on and off the ice. It will be crucial to the success of the season if the players AND parents follow through with the guidelines outlined below. From years of personal experience as a coach and player, I have found these techniques work best when clearly outlined.

It is our goal as a team and as an individual to display our three core values: hard work, discipline, and respect. On and off the ice it is our goal to live out these 3 core values.

Player Expectations

- Obtain a baseline concussion test annually.
- Practice is mandatory. No exceptions. If players do not attend practice, playing time will be affected.
- Unnecessary penalties, retaliation or anything of the sort will affect playing time.
- Coaches' discretion for game day attire.
- Warm up required for all home and away games. Attire to be set by coach at the beginning of the season.
- RESPECT the home facility, away facility, buses etc., leave better than you found it.
 This means picking up after yourself.
- All players are required to complete Safe sport through USA Hockey Website. Required for players over 16 years.
- USA Hockey number needed before the start of the season. Must be turned into to Joy Weires.
- School & Community If coach is made aware of a player's behavior at school or in the community that would negatively impact the team's reputation, players may be punished through lost ice time, or games.
- Bring a towel to practice and games. Soap is not optional!! :-)

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Player and Parent Expectations

- Parents and Players have a 24-hour rule. No communication with the coach 24 hours after the game.
- If there is a problem or issue that occurs, 1st contact will be made by the athlete. If not resolved, then parent involvement may be necessary through the board. Goal is for the problem to be handled through the athlete and the coach first.
- All issues need to be 1st handled through GBU Board. No contact with GBAYHA, or WAHA. Email must be sent to the Board first.
- Parents are not allowed in locker rooms, player hallways, or behind(around) the bench area, unless there is an injury.
- Parent volunteers who are acting as officials (Working the Clock, Penalty Box, Scoresheet, ...) are to be neutral. No cheering, no yelling, and no talking to the referees.
- Fundraisers- The fundraising requirements are stated on the Participation Fee Agreement.
